## Pollution Prevention

#### Household Activities

- Do not rinse spills with water! Sweep outdoor spills and dispose of in the trash. collection center (HHWCC). and bring to a household hazardous waste another absorbent material, then sweep For wet spills like oil, apply cat litter or
- Securely cover trash cans
- Take household hazardous waste to a household hazardous waste collection center.
- Store household hazardous waste in closed labeled containers inside or under a cover.
- Do not hose down your driveway, sidewalk or patio. Sweep up debris and dispose of in trash
- Always pick up after your pet. Flush waste down the toilet or dispose of in the trash.

### Household Hazardous Wastes include:

- Drain openers
- Oven cleaners
- Wood and metal cleaners and polishes

- Thermometers and other products containing mercury
- Fluorescent lamps
- Cathode ray tubes, e.g. TVs, computer
