

REMEMBER ON COLLECTION DAY

- 1 The carts should be placed at the curbside no later than 6:30 am on collection day.

---

- 2 The carts should be placed with the handles and wheels facing towards your home.

---

- 3 Place carts side-by-side approximately 1 foot apart & at least 3 feet from any obstruction (i. e. vehicles, fire hydrants, trees).

---

- 4 Carts should be removed from the curb and stored before 12:00 noon the following day.

WHITE GOODS HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES

White Goods, or household appliances containing Freon are picked up similar to a bulky item. Refrigerators contain Freon and other chemicals that require special handling. CR&R will collect bulky items and white goods from your curbside.

EXAMPLES INCLUDE:

- Refrigerators or Freezers
- Washers or Dryers
- Dishwashers
- Air Conditioners
- Ovens or Stoves
- Water Heaters

E-WASTE

Electronic Waste [e-Waste] is anything with a circuit board or battery. It is illegal to dispose of e-Waste in any of your automated carts. CR&R will collect and legally dispose of and recycle these items.

EXAMPLES OF E-WASTE INCLUDE:

- Monitors
- Televisions
- Cell Phones
- Printers
- Computers

**CUSTOMERS NEED TO ARRANGE FOR A FREE CURBSIDE PICKUP** of Bulky Items, White Goods or e-Waste by calling CR&R Customer Service at 714.372.8272 [Note: Each resident is entitled to four [4] free bulky item pickups annually].

BULKY ITEMS

Items that cannot fit in your automated carts are considered bulky items. Bulky items must be manageable by a two-person crew.

EXAMPLES OF BULKY ITEMS INCLUDE:

- Couches
- Tables
- Desks
- Mattresses
- Chairs
- Excess Green Waste

**NEW RESIDENTS:** If you are a new resident you may use your bulky item service to collect all of your paper, cardboard and packing material.

HAZARDOUS WASTE/BATTERIES

Hazardous wastes are products that are flammable, corrosive, reactive, or toxic. This includes batteries of all types, as they are considered hazardous waste in California when they are discarded. Therefore, it is illegal to dispose of them in regular trash or recycling; so don't place them in CR&R containers. This includes batteries of all types and sizes Alkaline (AAA, AA, C, D, 9 Volt), Lithium (button cell, power tool batteries, camera batteries, other electronics), Ni Cad (power tools), and other battery types both rechargeable and single use. Batteries must be taken to one of the following:

- household hazardous waste disposal facility
- universal waste handler
- local retailer (Home Depot, Lowes, Best Buy, Staples, Ikea, etc.)

**Why is this important? When lithium batteries are improperly disposed of they can cause fires in recycling centers, landfills, and garbage and recycling trucks.**

- Fluorescent Light Tubes
- Household Batteries
- Latex or Water Based Paint
- Non empty Aerosol Cans
- Thermostats
- High Intensity Discharge Lamps

You may use one of the County of Orange Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) drop off centers to properly dispose of any HHW.

If the holiday falls on a Saturday or Sunday, trash will be collected on your normal collection day with no delays to your pickup. If the holiday falls during the work week, collection for the remainder of the week may be delayed by one day. For example, if Independence Day falls on a Monday, and your normal collection day is on a Thursday, your pickup for that week will be on Friday

Use leftover dishwater to quickly rinse out residue.

CR&R provides a Christmas tree collection from December 26th until the end of January. The following guidelines are for residential curbside collection of Christmas trees.

- Please remove all ornaments, tinsel, lights and stand.
- Do not place trees in plastic bags.
- Place tree in your organics cart or beside your carts for collection.
- Trees 6 feet or taller must be cut in half.

Palm fronds are not recyclable. Please place cut palm fronds in the landfill cart.

## ORGANICS RECYCLING PROGRAM

To achieve diverting 75% of solid waste away from the landfill and complying with state regulations (AB 1594), the City of Orange launched your organics recycling program. The organics will be transported to CR&R's Anaerobic Digestion Facility (AD) in Perris, CA. The facility will convert all of the organic (yard and food waste) into fertilizer and renewable natural gas to fuel the collection fleet.
